On March 26, 1827, the world lost the greatest symphonic composer who ever lived. Thankfully, though, his music will live on forever. Throughout the 2026–2027 season, the Yakima Symphony Orchestra will be celebrating the music of Ludwig van Beethoven. Each of our Classical Series concerts will include at least one piece by Beethoven, and some concerts will be completely devoted to the great master. The symphonies that we will play throughout the season include Beethoven's first, his last—the epic *Symphony No. 9 "Ode to Joy,"*—and of course, the most famous symphony ever penned, Beethoven's fifth.

We also have an epic Pops Series lined up for you. In addition to our annual Holiday Pops Spectacular that will feature the **Kouyate Arts African Drumming Ensemble**, guest conductor **Dirk Meyer** will lead a patriotic salute to America at 250. We will celebrate the 95th birthday of legendary film composer John Williams, and also mark the 50th anniversary of Star Wars by performing **Star Wars: A New Hope** in concert; the film playing on a giant screen with the Yakima Symphony Orchestra playing the soundtrack live!





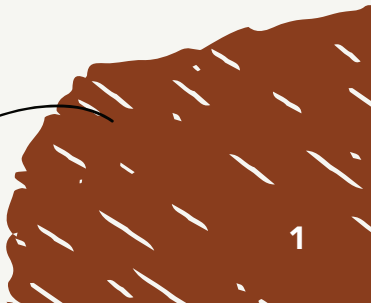
